Students receive instruction in recipe and menu planning, preparing and cooking of foods, food safety, managing of food supplies and kitchen resources, aesthetics of food presentation, and familiarity of a wide variety of cuisines and culinary techniques. Emphasis is placed on exposing students to a diverse menu that includes cuisines from around the world. Additionally, the menu also reflects traditional foods that are served during observed holidays from different cultures. Our students will be able to use their skills in the future, whether for family and friends in their own homes, or in a professional capacity. Some of our students have gone on to culinary schools and many more have been or are employed in the restaurant or hospitality industry. November: Responsibility


